**SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA  
‘LILY OF THE MOHAWK’  
FEAST DAY: JULY 14<sup>th</sup>**

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, was born in 1656 in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon, known today as Auriesville, New York. At a young age she contracted smallpox in an epidemic. Her family did not survive the epidemic. It left her face badly scarred and her vision was severely impacted.



She converted to Roman Catholicism at age nineteen, when she was renamed Kateri, baptized in honor of Saint Catherine of Siena.

She took a devout vow of perpetual virginity. She is often referred to as a lily, a traditional symbol of purity

associated with the Virgin Mary since the medieval period. Religious images of Tekakwitha are often decorated with a lily and cross, with feathers or turtle as cultural accessories alluding to her Native American birth.

Known for her virtue of chastity and mortification of the flesh, as well as being shunned by some of her tribe for her religious conversion to Catholicism, she is the fourth Native American to be venerated in the Roman Catholic Church and the first to be canonized. Upon her death at the age of 24, witnesses said that minutes later her small pox scars vanished and her face appeared radiant and beautiful. Under the pontificate of Pope John Paul II, she was beatified in 1980 and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI at Saint Peter's Basilica on October 21, 2012. Various miracles and supernatural events are attributed to her intercession.

We sometimes get calls from people who want to donate furniture, kitchen items, bedding, baby items, etc. This information from Catholic Charities may be helpful. All donations are delivered, free of charge, to needy individuals and families in Orange & Sullivan Counties in order to help improve their quality of life.

They gladly accept gently used / in good condition:

- Twin, full, queen beds – must be apart, with hardware
- Box springs accepted only if mattress is also included
- Dressers
- Kitchen / dining table & chairs (NO buffets / hutches)
- Living room furniture – loveseats, chairs coffee & end tables (NO SOFAS)
- Pots / pans, dishes, glasses, eating / cooking utensils
- Blankets, sheets, towels
- Infant & children's items (cribs, pack-n-play, swing, seat, clothing, diapers, wipes)
- Household decorations (must be boxed or bagged)
- Unopened toiletries (no razors)
- No: televisions larger than a 27” screen, Entertainment units, large desks, computers, electronics

Furniture must be on the first floor, or if possible, placed outside for pick-up, weather permitting. Donations other than large furniture may be dropped off at 27 Matthews St., Goshen.
